

#### **MAKE THAT KITCHEN SPARKLE**




#### **5** LOOK AFTER YOUR GARDEN

Generally, pests will accumulate in the garden and then move their way in. Cut them off at the source by keeping your garden clean and pruned. Cut your grass regularly and rake up piles of leaves as these are perfect nesting spots for pests. Fill up any holes or ditches to avoid the accumulation of water when it rains.



Gutters have a way of blocking themselves as is often the case after a heavy downpour. If you have debris often filling your gutter it is worth getting a gutter guard to avoid this. Clogged gutters will create stagnant water ponds which are a perfect breeding ground for mosquitos.





#### 7 CLOSE OFF YOUR CHIMNEY

Now that the hot weather has arrived there's no need to keep the fireplace going. Without the smoke to detract them this becomes an easy access point for any flying pests, rodents or the occasional possum wanting to find their way in. Just remember to open it before Santa comes with your presents!

## 8 TAKE CARE WHEN TRAVELING

Check your accommodation when you arrive, especially the bedding for any signs of a bed bug infestation. Check your suitcase again before repacking when returning home.
